# A chronological history of

# PARADISE PRIMITIVE BAPTIST CHURCH

# 2100 Nall Street Port Neches, TX

## I. CONSTITUTED: November 9, 1941

14 Members

Met upstairs in the Labor Union Hall of the Goolsby Building in downtown Pt. Neches Churches from Warren, TX; Rosepine, LA; Rock Springs, AR; and Pleasant Grove, AR gave the right arm to constitute church

Elder J. P. Dale was chosen as the first Pastor

Brother Clint Wilson was chosen as the first Clerk and Treasurer

Brothers E. F. Miller and Clint Wilson were ordained as first Deacons

#### II. HISTORY

January 11, 1942: Brother Woodrow Wilson was liberated to exercise in public

March 14, 1943: Brother Woodrow Wilson <u>ordained as an Elder</u> in the Primitive Baptist Church He would serve as an elder in the area churches for the rest of his life. He passed away June 21, 2004.

November 13, 1943: Elder Woodrow Wilson was <u>called as Pastor</u> of Paradise Primitive Baptist Church. He would serve faithfully and continuously as Pastor for the next 54 years.

1943: A modest church <u>building was erected</u> at the present-day site at 2100 Nall Street. It was basically a shell of a building for several years. In 1944 a building committee was appointed to look into improving the existing facilities. In 1945 the Church authorized the deacons to borrow \$1200 for the purpose of adding to the facilities.

June 1945: The church held a dedication service for the "new" building.

1948: Deacons were authorized to borrow an additional \$1000 to complete the work on the building.

November 10, 1951: The church purchased the extra lot beside the church building.

Note: Around 1950-1951, Kitchen and dining room was added.

The baptistery was added at some point between 1948 and 1955, possibly at same time kitchen and dining room was added. There is no record of exact dates in the Church history.

January 1957: The sign that sits out in the front of the building was installed as a gift to the church by one of the members.

October 1958: The auditorium was air conditioned.

September 1962: Hurricane Carla caused an evacuation of the area resulting in the first time services were not held at the Church.

1963: Brickstone was added to the exterior and the interior was remodeled.

March 25, 1965: Article appeared in <u>The Chronicle</u> about the Church.

1966: The kitchen and dining room was air conditioned

1991: Dining Room was painted. As far as we know, this was the first time it had been repainted since it was originally built.

November 1991: Celebrated the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Church. Four of the five (at that time) elders who had been ordained at Paradise were present with us. One had died in an auto accident several years before. Elder J. P. Dale, who was pastor at the time the church was constituted, was guest speaker for the weekend meeting.

November 13, 1993: Celebrated Elder Wilson's 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary as Pastor of Paradise PBC.

1996: Tore off brickstone siding, opening back up the windows on both sides of church. Installed new windows.

July 1999: The covered walkway from the dining room to the parking lot was donated by one member

July 1999: Had the parking lot paved.

August 1999: The covered back porch and walkway to the storage building was donated by family of two members.

November 2000: Established an <u>Annual Meeting</u> to be held the third weekend in April each year. This was done when the Bithynia Association, which the church had been a member of since 1941, folded in August 2000.

April 2001: First Annual Meeting held. Elder Luke Addison, grandson of Elder Marlvin Peterson (who was ordained at Paradise) was one of two guest speakers.

January 2005: Barnett Construction Company of Port Neches remodeled the interior of the Church.

September 24, 2005: Hurricane Rita hit! Had limbs from big trees come through windows in auditorium. Thankfully, only minor damages.

November 2007: Barnett again updated ceilings in auditorium.

September 24-25, 2008: Hurricane Ike hit! Church sustained some damages; new roof installed.

#### VIII. ARTICLES OF FAITH

- I. We believe in the one true and living God, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
- II. We believe that the Old and New Testaments are the inspiration of God, and the only rule of faith and practice, and prefer translation made under the authority of King James.
- III. We believe that the entire human family were created in Adam, their seminal head, and that all alike fell in him by his transgression of the law, and all partake of his sinful nature.
- IV. We believe in the doctrine of election, and that God chose his people before the foundation of the world.
- V. We believe that the chosen in Christ shall be called, regenerated, and sanctified by the Holy Spirit, and that they shall be preserved by the Grace of God eternally.

  - X. We believe in the resurrection of the body, and that the vile bodies of the saints that are chosen in Christ shall be fashioned like unto the Glorious body of Christ and, the felicity of the saints shall be eternal.

#### IX. SERVICES

Currently, services are held second through fifth Sundays at the Church in Port Neches. First Sundays are reserved to allow visitation among other Primitive Baptist Churches in the area. Our Pastor, Elder Mike Rhodes, also serves as Pastor of Canaan PB Church in Orange; and many members will attend services there on first Sundays.

We have a Biblically based, very simple worship service consisting of acapella singing beginning at 10:30 each Sunday morning, followed by prayer and preaching. We subscribe to the King James Version of the Bible, preferring the 1611 translation, believing it is the inspired Word of God.

We have lunch at church every Sunday, enjoying fellowship with each other. This has been a long-standing tradition of the Church as long as anyone can remember. At one time, we decided to limit lunch to once a month, but after a year, we reinstated it every Sunday.

While we are small band in numbers, we are great in faith and love. We would invite you to come and worship His Great and Holy Name with us at any time. You certainly will be welcomed.
